Monta Anthony - Spartanburg, SC

Although trained as a classical musician, Monta always felt more passionate about art than music. To feed her artistic urges, she studied art and pottery whenever possible while raising her four children. Having worked in watercolors, sculpture and large-scale murals, she found her love in oils, and has since accomplished many commissioned works. She is also inspired by her favorite color – red – and thus often primes her canvases in the bright, cheerful color. From Harley Davidsons and Airstreams to landscapes and portraits, Monta's paintings encapsulate both traditional and whimsical images of the South.
